April is upon us and the Lenten season has been left behind. After the triumph of Resurrection on Easter morning it seems easy to forget that we are a resurrection people, and we should be living our commitment to God every day of our lives; 12 months/ 52 weeks/365 days/24 hours every day.

Here are some ways we can practice resurrection in our daily lives:

- Give our full attention to whatever we are doing, and we'll recognize the constant renewal of life all around us.
- Leave the past to God's mercy. Leave the future to God's discretion. Living in the present moment, the only time when God brings forth new life, is a way of affirming our belief in resurrection.
- When we cultivate the art of making connections, the walls of separation come crashing down and new life can spring up out of the rubble.
- When we regularly pray for others as part of our devotional activities, we are practicing resurrection.
- Enthusiasm is the mark of a life-giver. When we can laugh and sing and relish life, we are practicing resurrection.
- Every time we forgive someone, another resurrection is in the making.
- Every time we accept God's grace in our life and see it in the world around us, it is our own resurrection is in the making.
- Practice gratitude and we are slaying the forces of boredom, despair, and taking-things-for-granted.
- Bring hope to someone in despair, bring healing to those in conflict, and we are contributing to the ongoing resurrection.
- When we welcome guests and alien ideas with graciousness, we are participating in a new world of hospitality.
- When we add even a small portion of joy to the lives of those around us, we bring resurrection into our community.

- Our little acts of kindness tenderize the world, add to the fund of good will, and set the table for resurrection.
- Love God, love our neighbor, and love our new life as marks of the resurrection.
- When we practice reverence for life, we can't help but notice all the little resurrections going on all around us, the continual process of creation on Earth.
- Find places to regularly practice silence; it will rejuvenate our souls.
- Welcome changes, big and small, in our experience and signal our receptivity to transformation and resurrection.
- Pay attention to visions and visionaries as likely conduits of resurrection for ourselves and our community.
- Every time we bring to life another's sense of wonder and affirm that we are all standing on holy ground, we practice resurrection.
- By respecting the mystery of God, human nature, and the natural world, we bear witness to the ineffable nature of renewal and rebirth.

These things and so much more can make us hyper aware of our spirituality and allow us to develop into disciples for the transformation of not only our community, but for the world!

## STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

*Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar—and to God what belongs to God.” (Matt. 22:21)*

Did you know?

The average tax refund in Wisconsin is \$2330! How will we spend our tax refunds? We know that some taxpayers do not receive a refund. But, of those who do, how do they spend it? The most popular answers are:

- 1) Pay off Debt;
- 2) Have fun – do something special or buy something special
- 3) Save it.

On most lists of ideas the thought of

- 4) Giving it Away to a favorite charity is either last on the list or never makes the list!

If we're going to "give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God," what are we called to give away? As people of faith we may wish to consider giving a tithe (10%) or some portion of our tax return to the church to say thank you to God for the jobs we have and the earnings we receive.

Consider tithing. If the average refund is \$2,330 and 10 people tithe at \$233 each, the total giving to your church would increase \$2,330. That might pay most of the heating bill for the winter or help you do something new and creative for Vacation Bible School.

Your tithe might be more or less than average, but a gift of \$233 would save 23 lives at \$10 apiece for the Imagine No Malaria Campaign. Gifts totaling \$2,330 would also make a big difference in paying the mission giving through our apportionments for a number of churches – for some it would pay their apportionments in full, for others it will cover 1/10 of the total or one month.
