God cares about the way we pursue the church's mission and the way we

love each other. The church is a group of people that live and serve together in such a way that their lives and communities are transformed. The church is designed for us to reach out to the world in the name of God. What we do as the church really matters.

We tend to equate church life with events and programs. But these are not what make a church. Programs help facilitate the life and mission of the church, and that's only one way we connect and reach out to the community.

What really matters is our interaction with the people God has placed in our lives. If we aren't connected with others, serving and being served, challenging and being challenged, then we're not living as God would desire and the church is not functioning as God would intend. The church is our spiritual connectedness.

Throughout the Bible, we see the interaction of the global church and the local church. Out of 114 times that the "church" is mentioned in the New Testament, at least ninety of them refer specifically to local gatherings of those who came together for fellowship, collaboration and support of God's mission in the world. God intends for us to be a part of such a gathering.

There are many that try to live the Christian life apart from serious, personal commitment to a local church. The reasons are many. We tend to think we're self-reliant and self-sufficient, and accountability to others that the Bible talks about frightens us. Many of us have been hurt in the past by things that have happened to us in the church, and others of us simply don't see the importance of being specifically connected to a local church. Therefore, one of the most

important things we can do is not speak negatively of God's church or its people in any way.

God brings us together in local churches to keep each other accountable. God desires us to gather together in local groups where we can celebrate God's presence in our lives, pray for one another and encourage one another. Being a disciple and growing disciples involves committing ourselves to a local church where we are joined together to grow together in Christ and to express Christ's love to the world around us.

Let us always be cognizant of Trinity's mission, "Connecting People to God and One Another", by using our spiritual gifts for God's Good Glory, living out our discipleship as we go about transforming our lives and our community.

On July 16 something unique will be coming to Montello, The Scottish Diaspora Tapestry will be on exhibit at the Montello Historic Society. The tapestry is a series of panels gathered from participating countries throughout the world tracing the migration of Scots who settled in foreign lands and shared their culture and heritage. This, of course, would include John Muir who came to Marquette County and eventually became the father of our National Park System.

Two of the panels were made by people in Marquette County. This tapestry has been shown in Europe, Australia and Canada. For now Montello is the ONLY city in the United States to host this exhibit. After July 31 it will go to Canada.

HARVEST SUPPER




