PASTOR'S MESSAGE

In last month's message I mentioned reaching out with "radical hospitality". I would like to further explain just what "radical hospitality" is and how we at Trinity can live it out!

Bishop Robert Schnase, in his book 'Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations', writes that "vibrant, fruitful, growing congregations practice radical hospitality: out of genuine love for Christ and for others, their laity and pastors take the initiative to invite, welcome, include and support newcomers and help them grow in faith as they become part of the body of Christ. Their members focus on those outside their congregation with as much passion as they attend to the nurture and growth of those who already belong to the family of faith, and they apply their utmost creativity, energy, and effectiveness to the task, exceeding all expectations. Christian hospitality refers to the active desire to invite, welcome, receive and care for those who are strangers so that they find a spiritual home and discover for themselves the unending richness of life in Christ" (page 11).

The fundamental purpose of the church is to draw people into a relationship with God so that we can live out the mission of the United Methodist Church "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world". People are searching for churches that make them feel welcome and loved, needed and accepted. We are to live out our local mission by "Connecting People to God and One Another". We do that by reaching out to everyone's uniqueness at the place they are in their spiritual lives.

"Radical hospitality" means there is a willingness to try new things; risking new ministries with no assurance of success that may attract people to come and meet new people, and

ultimately to see what the church has to offer. "Radical hospitality" means we might change locations of events and that we think of things that others might enjoy even if we may not all be comfortable with it. "Radical hospitality" is a willingness to see it offered to us in unusual places as well.

God has provided all we need to grow in our "radical hospitality". The Scriptures teach us as they give us encouragement, endurance, and support so that we will have hope. We pray and we study together. The more people who come and participate will help this congregation to grow and to be vibrant and fruitful. Good intentions are not enough. We can't keep doing things the way we always have and obtain different results. Let's be mindful that little changes can have big effects, and let us show a willingness to accept the change.

We succeed when "we develop maturity in Christ so that we will be able to get along with each other as well as Jesus gets along with us all (Romans 15:7, The Message)."

FOOD BANK NEWS
