One of the goals set by our Staff Parish Relations Committee is to attract new people to Trinity, whether they are new to the community, longtime residents, seekers or people that have never had a church home.

We're not trying to pretend to be something we're not in hope of attracting new persons. Clearly, we want those who are searching for a community of faith to visit Trinity, and we hope that when they come, they will experience vibrant, meaningful worship and the presence of God. Clearly, we hope they'll come back and bring their questions, commitments and their personal sense of God with them!

We at Trinity shouldn't ever say we have "arrived". We are always striving to learn how we can be the Body of Christ in this particular time and in this particular place. We are always discerning what traditions to hold onto and what to let go of. We are also a part of a larger faith community that believes in "Making Disciples for the Transformation of the World" and it isn't always easy to figure out when it is God's voice we are hearing or when it is our personal desires.

Are we being authentic, and how do our worship and our presence beyond our doors bring authentic witness to our faith? What do people experience when they visit Trinity? What do you experience here, you who are long time members, and you who have come here more recently? What feels genuine to you, and where do we need to pay attention to what we are conveying about who we are as individuals and as a community, and about God?

We can get a cup of coffee with our friends anywhere, but church is the only place we can get ashes smudged on our forehead as a reminder of our mortality. We can be dazzled by a light show at a concert on any given weekend, but

church is the only place that fills a sanctuary with candlelight and hymns on Christmas Eve. We can snag all sorts of freebies for brand loyalty online, but church is the only place where we are named a beloved child of God. We can share food with the hungry at any homeless shelter, but only the church teaches that a shared meal brings us into the very presence of God.

Please reach out to not only those new among us, but all those in our community with radical hospitality. Let's take radical hospitality to the streets. Let people know who we are and what we value. Create a buzz within the community about our church. Radical hospitality requires intentional invitation and welcome. It goes beyond greeters at the door and handshakes during worship to welcome every person as an honored guest.

Certainly, being a "friendly" church is good. But being in ministry in a confused and hurting world calls for "radical hospitality," which breathes our core value: people are important to God and to this church. We have the building blocks. Let's set them in motion. We are a congregation with Christian hearts and a Wesleyan spirit. Let's live out our mission of "Connecting People to God and One Another". Let's be sure to be radical!

## FINANCE TEAM REPORT

As you recall we had a Capital Improvement Fund campaign last fall. The purpose of this fund drive was to be able to do some maintenance and repairs on our church properties. Things that for various reasons were often times put off. The trustees compiled a list of things to be repaired or update, and happily many of the things were done with donated supplies. These things included:

- Repair the parking lot security lights
- Replace kitchen garbage disposal
- New water heater at parsonage
- Replace septic field pump
- New ballasts for lights in church
- New garage doors on Thrift Shop
- New furnace for narthex/office area

We are very thankful to the individuals who made all these repairs possible.

During our campaign we raised \$10627.50 which when added to the 684.00 already in the Trustees fund was enough to pay for sealing and repair the parking lot – just in time for our 30th anniversary celebration last August. The fund now has \$2311.00 left in it of which \$400.00 is for church door/keys repair and \$500.00 is for the Can Shed repair.

Once again we thank everyone who has and continues to donate to the trustees fund.

In light of the shortfall in paying apportionments the finance team has decided to start a special offering once a quarter dedicated to paying apportionments. We hope you will be able to give extra support above your normal giving to this special offering each quarter.

If you would more information on the budget of the church there is a current copy on the table in the narthex and feel free to talk to any member of the Finance Team – they are Brandon Daniels, Wayne Reiche, Jan Ebert, Vikki Trimble, Karlene Utke and Roger Eddingsaas.

## WORD WORMS

The Word Worms book club will be meeting on Friday May 13 at 10:00 AM in the Fellowship Hall. The book being reviewed is The Kalahari Typing School for Men by Alexander McCall Smith.



The Barnes and Noble review says: The fourth outing in the brilliant Precious Ramotswa series finds Botswana's intrepid female private detective struggling with a new set of unique difficulties. When Precious' assistant, Mma Grace Makusi, attempts to open a typing school for men, Precious and her fiancé do what they can to help while the cases and other travails pile up: Precious tries to help a flourishing engineer make up for the cruelty done to two women in his past; she also deals with competition from a new detective -- the arrogant and self-righteous Cephas Buthelezi -- who has opened another local agency. If that isn't enough, Precious also copes with her adopted son's withdrawn behavior and ensures that Mma Makusi's new love interest is on the up and up. No wonder there's no time to plan out her own long-delayed nuptials. Alexander McCall Smith once again approaches his tale with a sure hand and a poetic yet unpretentious voice that will draw you to a unique corner of the world. The engaging narrative calls up a vivid African landscape, and Smith's easy humor underscores plenty of perceptive commentary on the folly and foibles of society. Precious is a wonderfully charming protagonist who draws on her good common sense and the wise teachings of her family to solve all troubles. As with the other books in this endlessly appealing series, The Kalahari Typing School for Men is a satisfying and supple novel that moves adeptly between mystery and thoughtful study of a part of the world few Americans know well.

This book promises to be a great read. There is plenty of room around the table - join us even if you have not read the book - for a cup of coffee and some lively conversation.

## MISSION NEWS

The April Noisy Can brought in \$50.61 for the new church camp in the Dominican Republic. The May Noisy Can will go to Tiny Houses for Homeless Veterans

The federal government estimates that on any given night 47,725 veterans are homeless. Madison, WI, Seattle, WA, and cities around the country are trying to help by promoting the “tiny houses” movement.

The nonprofit Veterans Outreach of WI is building fifteen 128 square foot homes in Racine. The vets would get a lofted bed with a couch beneath, a desk, a little refrig and micro and a composting toilet. A community building in the center would have full bathrooms with showers and flush toilets and a full kitchen. This central building is where “the vets could go for free meals, camaraderie, drug and alcohol addiction counseling and veteran’s services”. While much of the labor and materials will be donated, money is still needed.

We, at Trinity, would like to help with this worthy cause. Give generously for the May Noisy Can to help end homelessness.



Also during the month of May we will be collecting items for the school bags to be taken to the Ingathering at Annual Conference in June.
