PASTOR'S PAGE

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed!

On Easter Sunday, we celebrated this good news, rediscovering for ourselves what the earliest followers of Jesus realized on that first Easter Sunday. Yet the implications of the resurrection are more than we can adequately ponder on one day. The season of Eastertide is actually 50 days long. So, you'll see that we'll be studying Easter scriptures in the weeks ahead.

The season of Easter gives us a chance to reflect more broadly and deeply on the meaning of the resurrection of Jesus. What might this involve? Here are a few ideas:

- You could meditate upon what the resurrection says about the character of Jesus Christ as the Righteous One of God (Psalm 16:10; Acts 2:25-28).
- You might ponder the fact that death has been swallowed up in victory (1 Corinthians 15:54-56).
- You could reflect upon the fact that the very power that raised Jesus from the dead is available to you today (Ephesians 1:15-23).
- You might think of how the resurrection of Jesus is a precursor to your own resurrection (1 Corinthians 15).
- You could consider how the resurrection gives us "new birth into a living hope" (1 Peter 1:3).

Eastertide allows us to think deeply and to pray about what the resurrection of Jesus means, both to us and to our world. Eastertide gives us a chance to take Scripture readings and to allow them to percolate in our hearts.

What would happen in our lives if we went through each day with a sixth-sense awareness of the resurrection? What would we attempt if we truly believed that the power that raised Jesus from the dead was available to us? What



difference would it make if we knew for sure that death has been defeated through Christ?



STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

“Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.” (2 Corinthians 9:7-8)

The apostle Paul reminds us of the Law of the Harvest: “whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.” How simple is that. Each year, every farmer has the same choice. Consume all the seed as food or give some back to the soil to ensure next year’s harvest.

And the same is true with the spiritual harvest where our seeds are our good works, financial giving, prayers, study, service, and worship. If one’s return is determined by his or her investment, then no farmer would sow sparingly or haphazardly and expect a beautiful, bountiful harvest. And neither should we.

The Law of Spirituality is as certain as the law of nature: When we live in the world of the flesh, we are tempted to withhold from God and withdraw from helping others. When we feel God’s abundance, however, we know and experience a bountiful return.

Additionally, God does not value gifts given reluctantly or under compulsion. We feel loved by God every day when we receive God’s gifts, of life and food and family and work, or at least we should. But, does God feel loved when he receives our gifts? Or, is he offended by the spirit in which they are given?

That is what it means to be a cheerful giver. We give because we love the recipient.

ELECTRONIC GIVING



Do you have a hard time remembering your giving envelope each Sunday? Would you like to not have to write a

check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.

Only regular offering to the general fund can be done electronically all special giving must be done manually. It’s safe secure and easy just ask someone who already does it. If you are interested ask Vikki for a form to fill out.

He's still paying attention to us no matter how horrible things might seem. He's in control."
