PASTOR'S PAGE

“Between Memory and Imagination”

Isaiah 51:1b-2a New International Version (NIV)

*“Look to the rock from which you were cut
and to the quarry from which you were hewn;
2 look to Abraham, your father,
and to Sarah, who gave you birth.”*

Churches battle between keeping memories alive and developing an imagination for the future. Our memories are a precious part of our health as a congregation, but to continue being a vital congregation that survives going forward, we need to imagine what that can look like. Our imaginations and the ability to innovate and adapt are a vital component of a healthy and vibrant church.

Unfortunately, most congregations tend to be toward the memory side, and slide into what is comfortable in their eyes, and things that can be very predictable.

Jesus dealt with systems that were very traditional. He worked hard to honor those that had gone before him, but continued to find ways to breathe new life into the Worship experience. Though there was a price he paid for his rebel behavior, he taught the people that a spiritual life wasn't about following rules of the past, but was about worshipping God in ways that ALL the people connected with.

We're being confronted with challenges of our culture that no longer reveres a Sunday set apart for church activities, but we complain about attendance rather than visioning ways to bring people in the door. We need to reframe what the church experience looks like for the culture we are now in.

When we face dwindling financial resources, we revert to our old thinking about our buildings rather than using our imagination to develop new sources of revenue. We need to think of our facilities as assets of the community rather than that of our own private club.

There are always choices to be made, especially when dealing with alternative responses. If we continue to only focus on keeping memories alive, we're only trying to survive, but passion drifts away, and it's unlikely a faith community can survive. It may not be recognized because it is a very slow death that is occurring.

The real issue is God's new leaders struggle, just like Jesus to change the status quo. But we can learn from history and realize our imagination is building a vibrant future for God's church to the people of, not only today, but the future as well.

I invite everyone to imagine what a spiritual experience can look like to ensure the survival of God's church for generations to come. God's coming new age, and the experiences that go with them, are not always apparent. We need to always be mindful of the future; a future that can develop a rich memory for coming generations.

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. 13 For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. 14 Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. (1 Corinthians 12:12-14)

A division of labor marks our occupations and social institutions in modern society: people perform highly specialized, but reciprocal and interdependent activities. This results both in greater benefits for the whole and greater dependence of individuals on one another.

Paul the Apostle recognized both this benefit and this interdependence among the followers of Christ. He likened us Christians to body parts. We form a whole Paul calls the Body of Christ, and we are interdependent, “The eye cannot say to the hand, ‘I have no need of you.’” Stewardship is like that. Our gifts work together for the good.

Arthur Tappan Pierson summarized the lesson of 1 Corinthians 12

- Every believer has some gift, therefore all should be encouraged.
- No one has all the gifts, therefore all should be humble.
- All gifts are for the Body, therefore all should be harmonious.
- All gifts are for the Lord, therefore all should be contented.
- All gifts are mutually helpful, therefore all should be faithful.
- All gifts promote the whole Body’s health; therefore none can be dispensed with.
- All gifts depend upon the Holy Spirit’s empowerment; therefore none should be out of fellowship with Him.

Stewardship strives to maximize the impact of our collective gifts.

ELECTRONIC GIVING

PARISH NURSE NEWS

We are embarking on the upcoming Influenza season. Recently, Marquette Co. Health Dept. provided a Flu Clinic at Trinity. Twelve individuals received a flu vaccine. Influenza is spread from person to person through droplets of moisture from an infected person that is spread through the air. This occurs when a person sneezes, coughs, or talks. The droplets contain the virus and when inhaled by someone other than the person can spread and cause the infection. A person can become symptomatic within one to three days of exposure from an infected person. A few of the symptoms include mild to severe that include fever, chills, headache, dry cough and muscle aches, as well as joint pain. Generally, individuals recover within a week after becoming ill, but may continue to feel tired for several days. If symptoms persist or worsen, it is best to seek medical advice from your physician. Those that have known medical conditions are at high risk for contracting influenza, as their immune system may be weakened. Those at risk, or interested in receiving the flu vaccine, generally should receive the vaccination during October and November. A reminder during this flu season, as well as any time, is to provide good hand washing measures to decrease and prevent the spread of the flu virus.
