## PASTOR'S PAGE

Many times, I've mentioned that we, as United Methodists, struggle to invite people to our church. The startling statistic is that we, on average, only invite someone to church every 39 years. While, if we really think about it, even 39 days would be insufficient!

We tend to convince ourselves that everyone we know already goes to church, but the reality is statistics prove otherwise. We are challenged by this because we actually don't like inviting people to church, and the fear of rejection is the primary reason. What we know is that about 51% Silent Generation goes to church and the percentages drop to 27% for the millennials.

As we go about our daily routine and conversation turns to church, there is prime opportunity to extend an invitation. If we're serious about sharing God's transforming love, then we should learn to overcome our fear of inviting people to a place where that can actually happen.

The Lewis Center for Church Leadership actually published 4 clues to help us with our endeavor. Here they are:

“1. **The invitation should be about a genuine connection and not staged.** It is best to invite individuals to an event that has bearing on their life or appeals to their interests. It comes across as a genuine connection and not something staged that comes out of left field. I might say, for instance, “I have an extra ticket to hear that new group you like on Friday at 7. I would love for you to come with me.” The connection is authentic because they have an interest in the group. If we translate this to inviting someone to church, then we share with them how the new sermon series on addictions may be helpful as they deal with a child in rehabilitation. The point is the invitation comes across as thoughtful and something that connects with the other person.

2. **Be specific.** Often, when we do invite, our invitations are very general. If I say to someone, “come to dinner at my house on Sunday,” it leaves out important information, like the time of dinner and where I live. A better dinner invitation is “come over at 5 p.m. on Sunday and

my address is 123 Main Street, which I will text you so you can Google directions.” The same principle applies to church. Simply saying, “Why don't you come to my church on Sunday,” is not as specific as “I would love for you to come to Main Street Congregation at 10 a.m. Our address is 123 Main Street, and I will meet you in the parking lot.” Be specific!

3. **Be honest about what we know and do not know.** Another reason many of us do not invite is that we are afraid someone may ask us questions to which we do not know the answer, such as, “Why do bad things happen to good people?” It is okay if we do not have all the answers. In many cases others are relieved that we do not know everything. This communicates to others that you are not trying to sell them a bill of goods. We all have been in situations where a salesperson was willing to tell us anything to get us to buy the product. To exaggerate the point, imagine a salesperson saying you need this vacuum cleaner (that works well on shag carpet) when they know you only have hardwood floors in the house. This would leave a bad taste in your mouth. Honesty goes a long way and individuals respect those who are upfront with them.

4. **It is important to invite with expectant hope.** Do not invite with a defeatist attitude. There are times when we so underplay the invitation it comes across as if we really do not want the other person to come. For instance, a friend saying, “My family reunion is on Saturday. It probably won't be fun, but you might want to come if you have absolutely nothing else to do.” This is not a compelling invite! But it's equally important not to go to the opposite extreme and be overly effusive. The goal is an invitation that leaves space for others to say yes without painting an overly negative or rosy picture.”

We seem to find inviting anybody, to anything an uneasy proposition, it's scary. And this becomes especially true for church, because we believe it's something so personal. Let's strive to make genuine connection with those around us as we live out our mission of “Connecting People to God and One Another”.

## STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

*The work of God is to be done by the people of God giving according to the will of God. (Sutherland & Nowery, The 33 Laws of Stewardship.)*

This is as good a definition of Stewardship as there is. Whenever there is something to be done in the Kingdom of God, the followers of God are the ones who are called to do it. This may be leading prayers, meeting in small groups, working in the community garden, balancing the church's books, inviting our neighbors to worship, visiting shut-ins, or serving the poor.

We do much of this work of God through or supported by our local churches. Worship is the most visible, perhaps, but many other activities are equally important, such as spiritual formation, congregational care, hospitality and outreach, or missions. Moreover, the local churches support the works of the conference and denomination, as well. In Wisconsin, this includes ministries like congregational revitalization and new church starts, or health and welfare ministries and, elsewhere, ministries such as Africa University.

Without the people of God giving according to the will of God, none of these things would be happening.

Sometime in the coming year, and for most of us, this fall, we will be called upon as God's people to give generously to support financially God's work in our local churches and beyond. This is a recurring call to discipleship that we all share through our connection in the Wisconsin Conference of the United Methodist Church.


## PRAYER GARDEN
