PASTOR'S MESSAGE

“Galileans, why are you standing there looking up at the sky? This Jesus, who was taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way that you saw him go to heaven.” Acts 1:11 Good News Translation (GNT)

After the long journey of Lent, the arrival of the Easter Season is a welcome time of joy and celebration. We are no longer called to fast and do penance but to celebrate the Risen Christ with great elation.

Easter is not just one day, but rather a 50-day period. The season of Easter, or Eastertide, begins at sunset on the eve of Easter and ends on Pentecost (May 20 this year), the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church.

Lent, which sometimes feels like it’s stretching on forever, is actually only forty days long. The initial purpose of the 50-day Easter season was to continue the faith formation of new Christians.

Today, this extended season gives us time to rejoice and experience what it means when we say Christ is risen. It’s the season when we remember our baptisms and how through this sacrament we are, “incorporated into Christ’s mighty acts of salvation.” As “Easter people,” we also celebrate and ponder the birth of the Church and gifts of the Spirit (Pentecost), and how we are to live as faithful disciples of Christ.

How can a family sustain this “Easter spirit” of celebration all the way to Pentecost? Here are some ways to celebrate the fifty days. Each week, pick an idea that seem right for you, or develop your own. You’ll be rejoicing long after the jelly beans and chocolate are gone!

1. Use a special candle at family meals to recall the light of Christ.
2. Every day, read together from the Easter story: Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; John 20-21.
3. Keep fresh flowers around.
4. Fly a kite to celebrate the wind of the Holy Spirit.

5. Talk about baptism. Tell stories of family members’ baptisms.
6. Read about the Emmaus disciples (Luke 24:13-35); take a family walk.
7. Make a commitment to a church ministry
8. Wear white, or even gold! They’re the season’s special colors.
9. Talk about how the disciples hid (John 20:19) until the Spirit’s coming at Pentecost. Follow up by playing hide and seek.
10. Plant some seeds.

As you can see, there are many creative ways the Easter season can be celebrated. I pray you have blessed, meaningful, Spirit filled Easter season.

From Writing a Money Autobiography by Dan Dick

A money autobiography is a reflection process on the role and influence of money and material possessions in our life. It challenges us to explore the past to see how our attitudes, assumptions, and values concerning money and wealth were formed.

Formative Questions

Reflect on these questions relating to how your family treated money when you were growing up:

- What is your earliest memory of money?
- What is your happiest memory in connection with money?
- What is your unhappiest money memory?
- What attitudes about money did your parents and other family members have?
- Did you feel rich, poor, or neither growing up? Did you worry about money when you were a child? A teenager?
- Where did your money come from? (Did you work for it, receive an allowance, have your parents buy you things, etc.?)
- Who governed how you related to money –how you spent money, saved money, gave money to charity or church?

It is useful to create a money autobiography journal to record your thoughts, reflections, and feelings. Then, you can return to the money autobiography journal months and years after ward.

INK CARTRIDGES AND ALUMINUM CANS



Remember the church recycles ink cartridges and aluminum cans. Just drop your empty cartridges in the box in the narthex, and your aluminum cans in the box next to the shed on the east side of the parking lot. We have volunteers who take them in for payment.

KWIK TRIP MILK MOOLA

The church now has its own account with the Milk Moola program through Kwik Trip. We will get \$.05 for each milk jug cap or milk bag top that we send in. We have a container in the narthex for you to drop your tops into. This is a great way for the church to raise a little extra money, bring in all your tops.



ELECTRONIC GIVING



Do you have a hard time remembering your giving envelope each Sunday? Would you like to not have to write a check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.

Only regular offering to the general fund can be done electronically all special giving must be done manually. Its safe secure and easy just ask someone who already does it. If you are interested ask Vikki for a form to fill out.

Camp is a time filled with fun activities such as campfires, games, hiking, boating, swimming and fellowship when campers learn about God and his love for us.

This year the conference is offering limited bus service for our campers. Thanks to a grant from the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, there is NO COST to ride the bus in 2018!
