FROM THE PASTOR

I wonder. I wonder what this church would look like, if this Christmas, we opened our hearts and minds to a new way of experiencing the Christmas Story... if we opened our thoughts to the idea of that childlike wonder that was ours at one time. God is waiting, in eager anticipation, like a child at Christmas, for us to come running to him with childlike faith.

Luke 18:17 "Unless one approaches the kingdom of heaven with the faith of a small child, they will never be able to enter it."

What is childlike faith? Childlike faith is the kind of faith that is not tainted by worldly experience. Being hurt or lost or broken callouses us for the rough terrain of this world. We become more cynical and lose sight of the wonder, faith and innocence we experience as a child. Our heart/minds start to forget to how to see God in the beauty of a unique and intricate snowflake, how to feel the endlessness of time while sledding with friends. We start to forget how to anticipate and expect miracles.

No other time of the year captures our imagination as much as Christmas: God coming into the world on a dark winter's night; a baby's cry that would change the course of human history; the heavens bursting into song; the certain hope that God will have the last word over our brokenness. This season fills our hearts with the wonder that anything is possible.

This will be my first Christmas of many with you. I can't wait to see the wonder that will spring up at Trinity propelling wonder into the community as we connect people with God and with each other. We have the vehicle to transform our community because God is our vehicle.

Will you join me this Advent in getting the word out about our "Wonder" series? Here's how it will work...

Each Sunday will focus on a different theme:

- Week 1 December 2 The Wonder of a Star
- Week 2 December 9 The Wonder of a Name
- Week 3 December 16 The Wonder of a Manger
- Week 4 December 23 The Wonder of a Promise

Along with the Sermon Series, Trinity will be offering Bible Studies for all ages. There will be a children's study focusing on the themes each week. Children will meet during regular Sunday School time. This is an excellent opportunity to invite someone you know to come and look through the lens of what God has done and what God will do. It will encourage our young ones to name that wonder and hang on to it. The Sundays for the Children's Study will take place on the above Sundays.

The Youth Study will take place on the Wednesdays before Advent on Wednesdays at the church starting at 4pm. The Youth study will be led by Noah Hanson and Lauren Olson. The four weeks will start on November 28th and run through December 19th. Youth seventh grade and up are invited to participate in this study and are encouraged to invite their friends. The adult study will be led by Pastor Kristen on Thursday nights from 6:30 until 7:30 starting November 29th and running through December 20th.

Registration for any of the events is through the church office by emailing mtumc@frontier.com or calling 297-2326. You may leave a message. If our adult small group grows to over 10, we will start a second group. I pray that you will find an opportunity that works for you in these next four weeks. I think that with this study, our Advent and Christmas will be that much more meaningful as will Christmases to come.

I am grateful to be spending these holidays with you, remembering the ultimate gift of God who came to be one of us. I wonder what it would look like if each of us participated in this study this year and invited someone to join us not only for the study but also for our Christmas Eve Service? I wonder!

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

Above all, maintain constant love for one another, for love covers a multitude of sins. Be hospitable to one another without complaining. Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. Whoever speaks must do so as one speaking the very words of God; whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. Living out our giftedness in the Body of Christ We share the gifts that the Holy Spirit has bestowed on us in order to build the church. We have all things in common: we study scripture and pray together, we are in fellowship and break bread together, we give generously and distribute the proceeds to meet our needs and the needs of others.

Witnessing to God's glory We as individuals and as the church exist to glorify God. The community of love is a light that shines for all to see. This stewardship season let us remember not just what we give, but why we give: so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ.

KWIK TRIP MILK MOOLA

The church has its own account with the Milk Moola program through Kwip Trip. We will get \$.05 for each milk jug cap or milk bag top that we send in. We have a container in the narthex for you to drop your tops into. This is a great way for the church to raise a little extra money, bring in all your tops.



INK CARTRIDGES AND ALUMINUM CANS



Remember the church recycles ink cartridges and aluminum cans. Just drop your empty cartridges in the box in the narthex, and your aluminum cans in the box next to the shed on the east side of the parking lot. We have volunteers who take them in for payment.

ELECTRONIC GIVING



Do you have a hard time remembering your giving envelope each Sunday? Would you like to not have to write a check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.
