THRIFT SHOP OPEN


Fridays and Saturdays

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Luke 24:36 New International Version (NIV)

36 While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

Worship is filled with many actions: heads bowed in prayer, arms raised in praise, coming forward to give an offering. One ancient and significant gesture in worship is passing of the peace. Passing the peace is a tradition rooted in Scripture that symbolizes our identity as peacemakers and trains ours hearts and tongues in the ways of peace. Christians have exercised this practice since the beginning. "Peace be with you" is a greeting Jesus used with his disciples. The apostle Paul opened his letters with the words "Grace and peace be with you".

The Passing of the Peace is an act of reconciliation and blessing which is based on the Christian Testament practice (Romans 16:16 advises, "Greet one another with a holy kiss"). These days, we're totally shy about kissing, and some are even hesitant to shake hands. Nonetheless, the act is significant, whether we shake hands, touch elbows, bump fists, or simply look one another in the eye as we greet each other. It's much more than a chance to say "Hi." In sharing words like "Peace be with you," and hearing the response "And also with you," we are reminded that we are bound together as God's children. We have the power to bless others with Christ's peace, but it's not easy! In worship, we practice sharing that life-giving act.

Today, at Trinity UMC, we pass the peace toward the conclusion of worship. It's when we leave the comfort of our seats, turn to our neighbors, address them, and share those words. The gesture is simple, but the meaning profound. Through that process we identify with Jesus. Furthermore, in the midst of our divisions we symbolize our unity through handshakes and hugs. Likewise, when we regularly pass the peace we practice God's call to make every effort to maintain the bond of peace.

It's also important to recognize the cumulative effect of weekly passing the peace. By regular

practice of this gesture, our hearts are shaped in the form of the words. Passing the peace gives us the vocabulary for expressing peace as we mature in faith and shapes our hearts and minds in the form of peace.

It's understandable that passing the peace still might make some of us nervous. We're often skeptical of worship practices that place words in our mouths or enjoin us to obligatory gestures. Raising arms in praise, standing for a Scripture reading, or walking forward for an offering might also make some uncomfortable.

It's interesting that similar practices in our culture make us less nervous. Consider sporting events and the singing of the national anthem while simultaneously placing a hand over one's heart. Moreover, consider the practice of after-game handshakes. From Little Leagues to the majors, athletes engage in this ritual of sportsmanship. We never question this gesture when it's introduced to our children, and most of us are uneasy when it's neglected.

All things considered, perhaps our anxiety over passing the peace is simply embarrassment. It moves us outside our comfort zone. What may be needed most when passing the peace is radical hospitality. When introducing the practice, we ought to acknowledge that it might feel strange. We need to give people permission to feel awkward and allow them time to ease their way into it.

Perhaps we should make it a normal practice whenever we gather; not just during worship. The peace of the Lord be with you.


KWIK TRIP MILK MOOLA

ELECTRONIC GIVING
