Winter will soon be over and spring will be here. Daylight savings time begins on Sunday March 11 at 2:00 AM. Remember to set your clocks ahead one hour before you go to bed on Saturday or you will be late for church.

PASTOR'S PAGE

"If any of you wants to be my follower," Jesus told them, "you must put aside your own pleasures and shoulder your cross, and follow me closely. ³⁵ If you insist on saving your life, you will lose it. Only those who throw away their lives for my sake and for the sake of the Good News will ever know what it means to really live". Mark 8: 34b-35 (TLB)

Lent, the period of 40 days before Easter, began on [Ash Wednesday](#), February 14, and will end at sundown on Holy Saturday, March 31, the evening before Easter.

During the Lenten season, we enter into a time of preparation, self-reflection and repentance as we seek to realign our lives and focus on God. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others, helping us to rid ourselves of distractions and our own selfishness. By doing so, we seek to live more faithfully as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the spirit of Lent is tempered with the joyous anticipation of the coming Resurrection.

This year, on April 1st, we will celebrate the risen Christ. Easter for Christians is not just one day, but rather a 50-day period. The season of Eastertide, begins at sunset on the eve of Easter and ends on Pentecost, the day we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church.

Easter is also more than just an extended celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. In the early church, the converts that had been studying for baptism during Lent, would be baptized on Easter Sunday. The initial purpose of the 50-day

Easter season was to continue the faith formation of new Christians.


Today, this extended season gives us time to rejoice and experience what it means when we say, "Christ is Risen". It's the season when we remember our baptisms and how we are, according to the liturgy, "incorporated into Christ's mighty acts of salvation" through the sacrament of Baptism. As "Easter people," we also celebrate and ponder the birth of the Church and gift of the Holy Spirit, and how we are to live as faithful disciples of Christ.

I invite you all to reflect personally upon yourselves during this season, determine how you can repent, and determine how you will "put aside your own pleasures and shoulder your cross", as we, Trinity United Methodist Church, live out our mission of "Connecting People to God and one another."

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

We recently shared with Stewardship leaders, this service of the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation. Now we share it with you.

By preparing a will, you can extend your Christian stewardship beyond your lifetime. In addition to providing for your family's needs, your will can direct how your assets will continue to support the missions and ministries you have supported in life.

A simple, cost-effective way to do it is to insert this text in your wills: **“After all my bills are paid, I want [x] percent of my estate to go to the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, Inc., to be used for such exempt purposes of the Foundation as are provided in a specific written instrument.”**

Then you provide the Foundation with a letter of instruction that says, **“In accordance with the will I have prepared, I have designated that [x] percent of my estate will be given to charity. The Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, Inc. has been designated to receive this bequest. I request the Foundation to distribute this bequest as follows:”**

You may then specify percentages to be given to a specific United Methodist church, Wisconsin UM health or welfare ministry, UM college or seminary, specific missionary or local community outreach organization. In fact, any religious or not-for-profit organization.

You may want to spend some time praying and thinking about the kinds of ministries that you have a calling to support. UM Global Ministries has a browsable, searchable list of mission projects by category, region, focus area, population served, etc.

SCRIP SHOPPING CARDS

 Many stores and businesses sell their shopping cards to the church at a discounted rate. INK CARTRIDGES AND ALUMINUM CANS



Remember the church recycles ink cartridges and aluminum cans. Just drop your empty cartridges in the box in the narthex, and your aluminum cans in the box next to the shed on the east side of the parking lot. We have volunteers who take them in for payment.

KWIK TRIP MILK MOOLA

The church now has its own account with the Milk Moola program through Kwik Trip.

We will get \$.05 for each milk jug cap or milk bag top that we send in. We have a container in the narthex for you to drop your tops into. This is a great way for the church to raise a little extra money, bring in all your tops.



ELECTRONIC GIVING



Do you have a hard time remembering your giving envelope each Sunday? Would you like to not have to write a check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.

REWOVEN

After Jen Hatmaker's dog shredded an heirloom baby blanket, she piled up the dirty yarn and asked her mother-in-law to somehow reassemble the original. In *Of Mess and Moxie* (Nelson Books), Hatmaker explains how this is a picture of God's sovereign work.

When our lives are tattered by sin and suffering, God doesn't start from scratch or create a replica. Instead, he uses the original threads to reweave a stronger version and to restore beauty. (Interestingly, when Joseph tells his brothers in Genesis 50:20 [ESV], "You meant evil against me, but God meant it for good," the word meant is Hebrew for wove.)

"Nothing bears a better witness than watching God resurrect someone's life," writes Hatmaker. "That is a God who folks want to know, a God worth his glory."
