PENTECOST SUNDAY




May 22

PASTOR'S PAGE

"No, he has told you what he wants, and this is all it is: to be fair, just, merciful, and to walk humbly with your God."— Micah 6:8 (TLB)

At the end of April, our Finance Team shared with the congregation our current financial challenges here at Trinity UMC. I pray that you have wholeheartedly prayed about your financial contribution to our beloved church and have either caught up with the pledge you made, have given a little extra to help through this challenging moment, or have been moved by God to increase your giving level.

God has invited us to be responsible for our lives and resources. We are not likely to manage well unless we acknowledge that we are managers. We are not likely to exercise good stewardship unless we recognize that we are stewards.

In Jesus' time, the steward was the manager of the household. The steward was not the owner of the assets but administrated the owner's property. We need to always be aware that all we have comes from God, so it is only appropriate to give back in praise of all that God has done for us.

We are all stewards of some possessions and influence, whether it be our time, our talent, our treasure, or caring for the earth we've been entrusted to.

Imagine Jesus standing before you and saying, "Take thou authority to be a steward." Then explore what that will mean in your daily life. How are stewardship and financial giving related?

Christian giving is a responsive act. It represents gratitude to God. It's a symbol of self-giving. Therefore, giving is not a once-for-all event, but a regular part of life. It's a spiritual discipline that reminds us who we are and whose we are.

The United Methodist Book of Discipline affirms and encourages tithing. Throughout Christian history, tithing has been a helpful way for people to assess their giving. The roots of the tradition are deep within Hebrew history. Most Christians


view tithe as a spiritual discipline rather than a mathematical legalism. Deuteronomy 14 (TLB) tells us, "*The purpose of tithe is to teach you always to put God first in your lives.*"

One way to ensure Trinity continues to provide the ministry and service we've come to expect is for us to consider tithe, using this definition. Give thanks to our Finance Team, that so diligently leads us through our financial times and trials here at Trinity UMC.

From Writing a Money Autobiography by Dan Dick

A money autobiography is a reflection process on the role and influence of money and material possessions in our life. It challenges us to explore the past to see how our attitudes, assumptions, and values concerning money and wealth were formed.

Values Questions concerning money & wealth

- In what ways are you a spender? A saver? In what ways are you generous? Stingy?
- Although money can't buy happiness, what are some of the things money can buy that bring happiness?
- What do you like best about money? What do you like least?
- What things in life are worth more than money? How does your lifestyle reflect the relative importance of these things to money?
- How has gender influenced your thinking about money? What differences do you see in how men and women relate to money?
- Which of the following words best communicates your attitudes and feelings about money? Why? Money is... power, security, hope, love, pleasure, prestige, dirty, value, anxiety, identity, a tool, freedom, protection, evil, comfort, fun.
- Reflect on times when you have given to meet the needs of another. Or, when you were on the receiving end of a gift? How did you feel?

It is useful to create a money autobiography journal to record your thoughts, reflections, and feelings. Then, you can return to the money autobiography journal months and years afterward.

INK CARTRIDGES AND ALUMINUM CANS



Remember the church recycles ink cartridges and aluminum cans. Just drop your empty cartridges in the box in the narthex, and your aluminum cans in the box next to the shed on the east side of the parking lot. We have volunteers who take them in for payment.

KWIK TRIP MILK MOOLA

ELECTRONIC GIVING





Do you have a hard time remembering your giving envelope each Sunday? Would you like to not have to write a check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.

THRIFT SHOP HELP NEEDED



Each bucket needs the following:

- One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. liquid laundry detergent
- 12 – 16 oz. liquid cleaner (no spray cleaners)
- 16 – 28 oz. dish soap
- Can air freshener (no trigger spray)
- 6 – 14 oz. insect repellent spray
- Scrub brush
- 18 handi wipes or reusable wipes (no wet wipes)
- 7 sponges (non-cellulose or foam only)
- 5 scouring pads (nothing with soap)
- 50 clothespins
- 100 ft. or two 50 ft. clothesline
- 24 roll heavy duty trash bags (33-45 gallon size)
- 2 dust masks
- 2 pairs of kitchen dish washing gloves
- 1 pair work gloves (cotton with leather palm or all leather)

Thank, Mom!

At his graduation, a young man tasked with giving a speech began reading from some notes. “I want to talk about my mother and the wonderful influence she had on my life,” he said. “She’s a shining example of parenthood, and I love her more than words can ever do justice.”

The graduate then paused, appeared to struggle a moment and looked up at the audience with a mischievous smile. “It’s really hard to read my mom’s handwriting,” he said.

RESTART YOUR HEART

Pain and loss are inescapable on this earth; fortunately, the Great Physician specializes in fixing hearts. Our participation is vital to recovery, though, as Danny Gokey sings in “Tell Your Heart to Beat Again.”

The song was inspired by a pastor asking to watch a cardiac surgeon — one of his congregants — in action. When the doctor attempted to restart the patient’s heart after repairing it, the organ wouldn’t cooperate. The surgeon knelt to speak to his patient: “We have fixed your heart. We have repaired it. There is nothing wrong with your heart. If you can hear me, I need you to tell your heart to beat again.” And it did — because she did.

“You can get back up again,” says Gokey, who faced loss when his first wife died. “You can move forward with your life, and you don’t have to walk with a limp.” God has fixed our hearts, Gokey says, but we need to recognize that — and begin to hope again.
