## PASTOR PAGE

October Greetings,

The word “diakonia” is a Greek word which is translated as “service”. The English word “deacon” comes from this word. As disciples of Jesus Christ we are servants of God. The life of a disciple reflects a placement of others before ourselves. Each day we should ask ourselves whether or not we’re consciously aware of the needs of others and, if we are, what we are we doing about it?

The actions we take, from praying to physically helping someone, reminds us of our ministry as Christ’s followers. We are called to share the Good News with others and in doing so bring our everyone into full communion with God.

The church, as the body of Christ, magnifies the efforts of each of us and translates individual service into community service. The church is the body and each one of us represents the members of the body who fulfill the commandment to love one another.

Our service to others might be seen as sacrificial; however, joyful giving of ourselves for the benefit of others draws our thinking away from the loss we may initially feel. Servanthood is not so much a goal to be striven for, but rather a gift we receive in the release of our hearts for the sake of God’s kingdom.

Writing to the Philippians, Paul encourages them to be unified in doing the work of the church. He encourages them to take on the heart of Christ in all they do. These are Paul’s words from Philippians 2:1-4:

*2 Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, <sup>2</sup> then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, <sup>4</sup> not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.*

My prayer for the people of Trinity, and for the church universal, is that we’ll feel the presence of the Holy Spirit and will be encouraged to take on the heart of Christ in all that we do. The world is filled with need, and there is ample work for everyone.

In the United Methodist Church, a Deacon is an ordained clergy person who is called to serve all people, particularly the poor, the sick, and the oppressed, and to equip and lead the laity in ministries of compassion, justice and service in the world. In this capacity, a Deacon leads the church in relating the church community to their ministries in the world, thus connecting the church’s worship with its service in the world.

Although in the United Methodist Church the title deacon is reserved for clergy, it’s an ancient term applied to anyone who takes on Christian service. We are a called people; called to be servants. I pray Paul’s words from Philippians will resonate within us as we reflect on the millions of people in need of love, prayers, and hands-on assistance.

## STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

*Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' ... But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (Matthew 6:31, 33, NRSV)*

According to John the Baptist, we must “Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand.” (KJV) What does repentant Stewardship look like?

I recently (re)read A Spirituality of Fundraising by Henri Nouwen. He provides some answers to the question, “What will Stewardship look like in the Kingdom of God?” Here is a summary based on Nouwen’s thoughts on stewardship as faithful discipleship.

**Security in God.** Do we place our trust in God or mammon? What is our relationship to money? There is money in the Kingdom; it finances building a community of love. However, there are no money worries, because in the Kingdom there is abundance rather than scarcity.

**Community of Love.** In the community of love, we care for one another and serve our neighbors. The middle class often resents the rich and fears the poor. In the Kingdom, we include all and love all alike.

**Invitation.** We invite everyone to abide in the Kingdom and participate in the building of the community of love. This means we are comfortable asking for money, because money is what the community needs to be fruitful in its missions and ministries.

**Prayer and Gratitude.** It is in prayer that our conversion begins because it re-orientes our thoughts toward money, toward others and toward our goal of the beloved community. “As our prayer deepens into constant awareness of God’s goodness, the spirit of gratitude grows within us.” (Nouwen, p. 57).

## SCRIP SHOPPING CARDS

If you buy these cards through the church you still get the full face value of the card and the church gets the discount, so it costs you nothing extra to support the church. If you are thinking of a large purchase such as a new TV or computer, why not ask Susan to order extra cards for you to pay for it. It would make a great addition to your giving to the church.

Susan usually has the basic Walmart and Kwik Trip cards on hand all the time. If there is a special store you are interested in purchasing cards from talk to Susan and she will see if they are available.

## KWIK TRIP MILK MOOLA

The church now has its own account with the Milk Moola program through Kwik Trip. We will get \$ .05 for each milk jug cap or milk bag top that we send in. We have a container in the narthex for you to drop your tops into. This is a great way for the church to raise a little extra money, bring in all your tops.



## ELECTRONIC GIVING



Do you have a hard time remembering your giving envelope each Sunday? Would you like to not have to write a check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.

## HOLIDAY TRAIL



### Plumb Line



In the writings of the prophets Isaiah and Amos, a plumb line is a symbol of God's judgment of Israel: "I will make justice the measuring line and righteousness the plumb line" (Isaiah 28:17, NIV); The Lord was standing by a wall that had been built true to plumb, with a plumb line in his hand. ... Then the Lord said, "Look, I am setting a plumb line among my people Israel; I will spare them no longer" (Amos 7:7-8, NIV). When Jesus is portrayed as Judge of the world, he is sometimes shown holding a plumb line.
