STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

I could not speak to you as spiritual people, but rather as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready... (1 Corinthians 3:1-2)

The goal of discipleship is spiritual maturity. As Scripture tells us in Hebrews 6:1, “Therefore let us go on toward perfection, leaving behind the basic teaching about Christ, and not laying again the foundation”.

The aim of mature spirituality is to have the same mindset as Christ Jesus, but usually comes in stages of commitment whether it be prayer, presence, service, witness, or giving. Previously, we identified four stages of giving.

In Stage 1, people spend on themselves and give to God from what is left over. They usually give little or nothing. They are not ready to commit.

In Stage 2, people take responsibility and wonder what equal shares of the goal (e.g., church budget) are. Of course, this fails to recognize that households have different levels of resources. People at this stage are ready to give regularly and many of commit to pledging.

In Stage 3, people want to put God first in their lives, even if they must change spending habits and attitudes toward having things. They understand that an offering to God is intended to be a sacrifice. They look to move toward tithing, giving ten percent of their income to God, by increasing the percentage of income they give each year.

In Stage 4, people want to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. They see even what they spend on their own needs to be support for their discipleship. Often, their giving to church substantially exceeds the 10 percent tithing mark.

Where are you in your discipleship journey? Is this the year, you make a change? Let’s pray for one another as we grow together.

FINANCE NEWS

The Finance Committee would like to thank everyone who helped out with the Adopt-a-Bill program in July. We received 80% of the funds needed to pay all the bills listed. Work is in progress to try and lower some of them for the future. It has been decided to present this program the first month of each quarter to help lessen the strain on finances for the church.

We would also like to thank all those who have started to use our SCRIP program. This is definitely a way to help the church out without reaching into your own pocket. We are working hard on directing the church through these tough economic times and appreciate all your support.

SCRIP SHOPPING CARDS

 Many stores and businesses sell their shopping

cards to the church at a discounted rate. If you buy these cards through the church you still get the full face value of the card and the church gets the discount, so it costs you nothing extra to support the church. If you are thinking of a large purchase such as a new TV or computer, why not ask Susan to order extra cards for you to pay for it. It would make a great addition to your giving to the church.

Susan usually has the basic Walmart and Kwik Trip cards on hand all the time. If there is a special store you are interested in purchasing cards from talk to Susan and she will see if they are available.

KWIK TRIP MILK MOOLA

The church now has its own account with the Milk Moola program through Kwik Trip. We will get \$.05 for each milk jug cap or milk bag top that we send in. We have a container in the narthex for you to drop your tops into. This is a great way for the church to raise a little extra money, bring in all your tops.



INK CARTRIDGES AND ALUMINUM CANS



Remember the church recycles ink cartridges and aluminum cans. Just drop your empty cartridges in the box in the narthex, and your aluminum cans in the box next to the shed on the east side of the parking lot. We have volunteers who take them in for payment.

ELECTRONIC GIVING



Do you have a hard time remembering your giving envelope each Sunday? Would you like to not have to write a check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.

Only regular offering to the general fund can be done electronically all special giving must be done manually. Its safe secure and easy just ask someone who already does it. If you are interested ask Vikki for a form to fill out.

ALZHEIMER'S WALK

Lace up those shoes! It is time for the annual Alzheimer's Walk.

Our very own "Trinity Trotters" team will be participating in the event. The event will take place in Portage, WI on Sunday, September 9th. Registration begins that day at 1:00 pm at Riverside Park 300 East Wisconsin St. Participants may also register online at support.alzisc.org/columbia prior to walking.

The walk begins at 2:25 p.m. The 2-mile walk is on a flat paved surface that follows the banks of the Wisconsin River. You DO NOT need to complete 2 miles in order to participate in the walk. An attitude of walk as far as you feel you can or are comfortable walking is the motto. This is NOT a competitive walk. It is an opportunity to help those afflicted with Alzheimer's/Dementia.

If you are not able to make the walk that day, consider being a virtual walker. All you need to do is register as a "virtual Participant" on the registration page on the walk website. There are incentive prizes for individuals, and teams that raise money for those that are walking. All funds stay in Wisconsin!! The Alzheimer's and Dementia Alliance of Wisconsin staff are committed to assisting individuals that are affected by this debilitating disease to live a life with quality, and dignity.

Cyndi Turner has done a painting in honor of her mother, for the Alzheimer's Walk. For a donation of \$10.00, you can have a loved one's name/ or caregivers name, signed on the painting to honor that individual. The painting stays with the Alzheimer's Alliance and travels to places throughout the year. The names on the painting are also read at the walk to remember them.

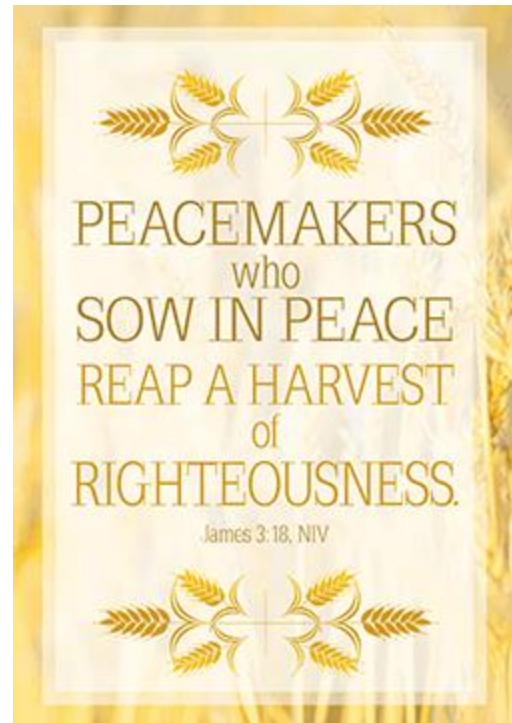
