Trinity UMC Montello – Fifteen Years From Now

Fifteen-ish years ago (which doesn't seem like it was in the distant past), Hannah's dad and I found out that we were going to have a baby girl. I couldn't have been happier! We spent our time reading about how to care for a baby, we spent our money on things to take care of the baby, we spent our attention on planning for the baby. We were so anxious to meet her that our excitement was palpable! People would say things like, "You're glowing!" And, "You look so happy! "Guess where our hearts were. You didn't need to look far to know that our hearts were where our treasure was.

I remember thinking, "What on earth did we spend our time, our energy and our money on before Hannah?" She came into our lives and we automatically made room. This happened kind of magically. I remember not eating out as much – not a big deal. When my jeans started to get worn, I wore them six months longer. There was less waste in our refrigerator. We set the thermostat lower at night.

How does this relate to the church?

In the five months I've been your pastor, I've been impressed by the passion and generosity of this charming, small-town church. I delight in walking along-side you in your faith journey and helping you grow in your discipleship.

When I arrived, I was made aware that we had some financial challenges. Most churches do these days. Growing apathy and dying dedicated members have taken a toll. Over the past year, some of our biggest financial supporters had been promoted to heaven. Although it would be great to think that the church magically exists for the glory of God, it still has bills and salaries to pay. It has worship and education to offer, and ideally, mission to support. We have a budget.

Right now, we are in a challenging place as Trinity UMC Montello. We are able to take care of our financial obligations for the short term. But, with our bare-boned budget as it is, we are currently taking a couple thousand out of our savings each month to meet our obligations. Already we have stopped paying on some of our obligations in hopes of making some headway. In a few months the well will be dry and we'll have to figure out how to exist in a different way.

What will Trinity look like 15 years from now? Well, that's up to you. Hypothetically, it could be a growing congregation with a satellite location in Oxford, or it could be a shrinking church with a shared pastor who comes around on Sunday mornings to preach.

It's time to roll up our sleeves. Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Is your treasure here? If so, we need your help sooner rather than later. We need to be able to turn things around so that Trinity can be sustainable in this community. I'd like to ask you to seriously consider the following:

- 1. Re-examine your stewardship practices. Is God getting your first and best? Is this an opportunity to take a step of faith to increase your giving? One way to improve accountability and take the strain of remembering to write that check it to set up automatic deposit. It's simple! Just fill out the quick form found in the information rack by the church office.
- 2. Gifts can take all sorts of forms. In fact, you can give gifts of stocks or bonds, stock/ bond interest, property, residue of estate, designate certain assets, or make the church an official beneficiary. Put a note in the collection plate that you would like to schedule this conversation.
- 3. You can give a large one-time gift in honor or in memory of someone.
- 4. If you don't give anything, start by giving something. If you give a little bit, open your heart to God and give a little more.

Currently our Finance team is working on various stewardship campaigns and fundraisers. We are focusing on the best ways to get out into the community, we are pouring our best into events

Trinity United Methodist Church and activities that will attract people, we are stepping boldly into exciting Sunday school curriculum and I am getting to know folks and forging my very best sermons.

Every day I lift us up on prayer. I believe that God has a plan for us here at Trinity. I believe that I am in the midst of passionate people.

I have one more story for you. Two years ago, I attended Dave Ramsay's Financial Peace University. It was life transforming! One of the challenges that was put to us was this: "If your child was dying and you needed one thousand dollars by the end of the week to get lifesaving medicine. Could you get it?" My first thought was, "Geez! What??!" Then I put myself in the situation. I thought, If Hannah's life were on the line, could I make this happen? Motivation! I sold some things on Craigslist that had sentimental value, but I seldom used and did some odd jobs. In a week I came up with \$1000.00 that I didn't realize I had. And you know what? I don't miss the things I sold. It actually was quite empowering. It took a lot of work, but was it worth it? Yes! I had no idea I had anything of value. What I had was a bunch of stuff with little value put together.

What I'm asking you to do is something like this. Get creative. The church needs you now. God needs you now. I need you now. Let us prayerfully go forward as we push this thing up the hill.

1 Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion,2 then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind.3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves. (Philippians 2:1-3)

The folks at Network for Good remind us that giving is a human transaction; we usually give for reasons of the heart (emotionally) rather than for reasons of the head (rationally). Here are some reasons that donors have given for their contributions:

- •Someone I know asked me to give, and I wanted to help them
- •Felt emotionally moved by someone's story
- •Want to feel I'm not powerless in the face of need and can help (this is especially true during disasters)
- •Want to feel I'm changing someone's life
- •Feel a sense of closeness to my church
- •Want to memorialize someone
- •Was raised to give to church—it's tradition in my family
- •It makes me feel connected to other people and builds my social network
- •Want to have a good image of myself/my family
- •Want to leave a legacy that perpetuates my support for the church
- •Feel fortunate and want to give something back to others
- •My faith teaches me to support the church
- •Want to be seen as a leader/role model

Why do you give? The stewardship leaders of your church should be asking this question of you on a regular basis. If they don't, ask them why not?

Many stores and sell shopping

Our book club will meet on Friday April 12 at 10:00 AM in the fellowship hall. We will be discussing the book <u>Before We Were Yours</u> by Lisa Wingate.

"Two families, generations apart, are forever changed by a heartbreaking injustice in this poignant novel, inspired by a true story, for readers of ORPHAN TRAIN and THE NIGHTINGALE.

Memphis, 1939. Twelve-year-old Rill Foss and her four younger siblings live a magical life aboard their family's Mississippi River shantyboat. But when their father must rush their mother to the hospital one stormy night, Rill is left in charge --- until strangers arrive in force. Wrenched from all that is familiar and thrown into a Tennessee Children's Home Society orphanage, the Foss children are assured that they will soon be returned to their parents --- but they quickly realize the dark truth. At the mercy of the facility's cruel director, Rill fights to keep her sisters and brother together in a world of danger and uncertainty.

Aiken, South Carolina, present day. Born into wealth and privilege, Avery Stafford seems to have it all: a successful career as a federal prosecutor, a handsome fiancé, and a lavish wedding on the horizon. But when Avery returns home to help her father weather a health crisis, a chance encounter leaves her with uncomfortable questions and compels her to take a journey through her family's long-hidden history, on a path that will ultimately lead either to devastation or to redemption.

Based on one of America's most notorious reallife scandals --- in which Georgia Tann, director of a Memphis-based adoption organization, kidnapped and sold poor children to wealthy families all over the country --- Lisa Wingate's riveting, wrenching and ultimately uplifting tale reminds us how, even though the paths we take can lead to many places, the heart never forgets where we belong."

Each year we collect donations for the Ingathering at Annual Conference. The committee has decided to once again collect for flood buckets, this is near and dear to many of us with the flooding last fall and already this spring and the spring storms have not even begun yet. Following is a list of things that will be needed for each bucket and we hope to fill at least 10. Please consider picking up an item or two as your shop over the next couple of months.

#### UMCOR Cleaning Kit (\$75 Value) \* Updated May 2018

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Sizes are very specific so all items will fit in the 5-gallon bucket. Bigger is NOT better.

- 5 gallon bucket with a re-sealable lid (Buckets can be reused if cleaned except those that have stored chemicals i.e. paint or pool supplies - no 20-liter buckets)
- · I liquid laundry detergent: 32 to 64 oz. No fabric softener
- I bottle liquid household cleaner to mix with water: 16 to 40 oz. (no spray bottles)
- I bottle dish soap: 16 to 34 oz.
- I 4 to 8 oz pump spray air freshener (3 solid or gel air fresheners are also acceptable)
- I insect repellent spray 6 to I4 oz. such as "Off" or "Cutter" brand (pack of I0-20 wipes also acceptable)
- · I scrub brush plastic or wooden handle
- 18 cleaning towels "Handi Wipes" or reusable wipes (no wet wipes, microfiber or terrycloth cleaning towels)
- 5 scouring pad sponges (no stainless steel, Brillo pads, or SOS pads-nothing with soap built in)
- 36 50 clothes pins
- cotton or plastic clothes line 70' to 100'
- · 24-bag roll of heavy duty trash bags 33 to 45 gallon sizes
- 5 N95 particulate respirator dust masks (I 3 mm thick)
- 2 pairs kitchen dishwashing gloves should be durable for multiple uses
- . I pair work gloves cotton with leather palm or all leather
- \$3.00 to cover the cost of sponges and shipping (not in bucket)
