Trinity United Methodist Church PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord always and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways trust in him and he will lay out the way ahead of you."

I struggled to write this article. I don't know why. Writer's block? Feeling overwhelmed with topics to discuss going into the new year? Just exhausted? I visited a couple of ideas and then thought, "No... that's not what I want to talk about right now, so the thoughts kept whirling around and not settling. So, I prayed. Sometimes I have a really hard time putting my thoughts into words. Then God said to me, "Just write. Don't have a destination in mind. Just write." So, this is the result of that experience.

I still don't know what I'm writing about. Sometimes it's clear as a bell and I think, "I need to write about this or that," and the idea comes together. Other times, like this, God keeps the result hidden until we get there together.

I have to admit, that when I pray, often I don't have words. The Holy Spirit and I simply communicate. Those are actually the most intense discussions I have with God. There are conversations that are more complex than words, so the Spirit takes over.

I have learned to not have anxiety around this. Even if it happens to me on Sunday mornings. I think it's God's way of saying, "Let go. I need you to trust me and not think you have to have all the answers. Sometimes I don't reveal the answers until the right time, because I am creating something that is evolving."

I have to admit; I didn't always think this way. And it's not about how much I prepare for something or do the legwork. It's about starting with God and ending with God. It's about knowing that God is in every detail and will supply what I need when I make it about Him. It's about going to God first and saying, "You are with me. I need your love and guidance to do this thing. Show me what you have for me. Give me the words and the strength and the resources I need to do your will in this." I started the preparation for this article by scanning the world news stories. Then I looked at the local news stories, then I thought about the needs and issues of our community. I didn't know where to start. What message of hope could I offer as we close out 2018 that would encompass all the things I wanted to cover?

I realized it was completely beyond anything I could come up with. And so, I froze. I procrastinated. When I finally sunk my head into my hands and said, "God, I can't figure this out!" God said, "You forgot to start with me. It's not up to you to have all the answers and know how to handle every situation. It's not up to you to be brilliant or clever or poignant. I will give you those things when you need them to do what needs to be done in my name."

As I thought about this, I first thought that it's good that God will make me brilliant and clever and poignant when it matters. But then I realized that the way He does this is through his body – the church. Have you ever noticed what we can do together when we are all on board and put God first and foremost? I have a particular skill – a gift at doing something special. And, you have a skillset to do something else. Surrendering to God means hanging up my expectations or reservations about myself and just moving forward with what I have to offer in God's name.

I won't always have all the answers. In fact, I will seldom have the answers. I will not be the most talented or have the absolute words that are needed in a given circumstance, but when I rely on the Holy Spirit for these things... when we rely on the Holy Spirit together to make us more than the sum of our parts... miracles happen!

As we go into 2019, let us go forward with God before us, behind us, in us and around us. Let us encourage each other to always look to the Holy Spirit in everything we do and lean on each other as God intends us to. In this way, we can face anything that comes in 2019 whether it is in the world, in our community or in our home.

Romans 15:13 "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Amen!

"Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. (Matthew 7:7-8)

Henri Nouwen has said, "Asking people for money is giving them the opportunity to put their resources at the disposal of the Kingdom." If God wants us to build the Kingdom of God, then he wants us to invite others to support it. This is evangelism because the good news is that God has faith in us to build the Kingdom.

There are a number of steps in the asking process and asking is a later step, not the first:

Ask God First!

We must first trust in God that we can succeed in soliciting support for the missions and ministries we seek to support. We come to God in prayer to ask God for support before asking anyone else.

Love the person you are asking

We must also love the person we are asking for support, giving them the means to become a brother or sister in Christ through their support of the Kingdom. We must trust that the Spirit of Christ that is guiding us is also guiding them.

Ask on behalf of the Kingdom of God

We are asking potential donors to invest in the work of God. Whether their ability to give is great or small, what matters is that they are making their gift available to God.

Be grateful for the answer

Whether the answer is yes or no or maybe or someday, we must be grateful that the person listened and gave us an honest answer. We have offered something of great value and that is what is important to us

Nbah Hanson left his home and family in Montello, backpack in tow, seeking truth and meaning in the world only to find it in something he had never believed in.
