A blood drive will be held at Trinity on Wednesday June 26th from Noon - 6:00

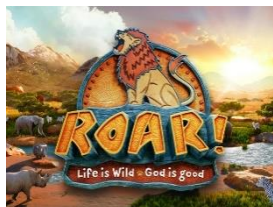

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

Are you giving to the church in all the ways you could or should be giving?

You may be supporting this year's budget, but what about the future of the church, missional support, and special projects? Are you providing for these as well?

Think of the church's assets and giving as an ice-cream cone. The church's assets such as the building, parsonage, and endowments as the cone. Essential, but not very appetizing all by themselves.

Annual budget giving is the first scoop. It is needed and provides basic support and flavor to the church. However, too often, this is where we stop thinking about supporting the church. What about other scoops?

What about missions? Mission-related giving can include apportionments (sometimes paid with the annual budget, sometimes not), conference projects, Special Sundays, UMCOR, national and international advance projects and support of individual missionaries. Are you thinking about your offering for missions this year? These are usually donations over and above what is collected for the annual budget.

What about planned giving? Planned giving provides for the future of the church when you are no longer around. Have you included the church in your will or as a beneficiary to your investment accounts or life insurance? Ten percent is a good number, leaving plenty for your family.

Finally, what about special projects. Capital fundraising can support new ministry, ministry growth, new building or renovation and maintenance of existing structures. Remember the Imagine No Malaria campaign a couple of years back that raised over one million dollars?

ELECTRONIC GIVING

check to the church each week? Then electronic giving might be for you. You can have funds transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church account – it can be done bi-monthly, monthly or quarterly.

Only regular offering to the general fund can be done electronically all special giving must be done manually. Its safe secure and easy just ask someone who already does it. If you are interested ask Vikki for a form to fill out.

WORD WORMS

The book club will meet on Friday June 14 at 10:00 AM in the Fellowship Hall to discuss the book The Orphan Tale by Pam Jenoff.



A powerful novel of friendship set in a traveling circus during World War II, *The Orphan's Tale* introduces two extraordinary women and their harrowing stories of sacrifice and survival.

Sixteen-year-old Noa has been cast out in disgrace after becoming pregnant by a Nazi soldier and being forced to give up her baby. She lives above a small rail station, which she cleans in order to earn her keep... When Noa discovers a boxcar containing dozens of Jewish infants bound for a concentration camp, she is reminded of the child that was taken from her. And in a moment that will change the course of her life, she snatches one of the babies and flees into the snowy night.

Noa finds refuge with a German circus, but she must learn the flying trapeze act so she can blend in undetected, spurning the resentment of the lead aerialist, Astrid. At first rivals, Noa and Astrid soon forge a powerful bond. But as the facade that protects them proves increasingly tenuous, Noa and Astrid must decide whether their friendship is enough to save one another—or if the secrets that burn between them will destroy everything.

The Heifer project was a great success with \$1188.77 collected. Thanks to all who have helped in small way with the problem of hunger in the world.



Each year we collect donations for the Ingathering at Annual Conference. The committee has decided to once again collect for flood buckets, this is near and dear to many of us with the flooding last fall and already this spring and the spring storms have not even begun yet. Following is a list of things that will be needed for each bucket and we hope to fill at least 10. Please consider picking up an item or two as you shop over the next couple of months.

UMCOR Cleaning Kit (\$75 Value) * Updated May 2018

PLEASE NOTE: Sizes are very specific so all items will fit in the 5-gallon bucket. Bigger is NOT better.

- 5 gallon bucket with a re-sealable lid
(Buckets can be reused if cleaned except those that have stored chemicals i.e. paint or pool supplies - no 20-liter buckets)
- 1 liquid laundry detergent: 32 to 64 oz. No fabric softener
- 1 bottle liquid household cleaner to mix with water: 16 to 40 oz. (no spray bottles)
- 1 bottle dish soap: 16 to 34 oz.
- 1 4 to 8 oz pump spray air freshener (3 solid or gel air fresheners are also acceptable)
- 1 insect repellent spray - 6 to 14 oz. such as "Off" or "Cutter" brand (pack of 10-20 wipes also acceptable)
- 1 scrub brush - plastic or wooden handle
- 18 cleaning towels - "Handi Wipes" or reusable wipes (no wet wipes, microfiber or terrycloth cleaning towels)
- 5 scouring pad sponges (no stainless steel, Brillo pads, or SOS pads-nothing with soap built in)
- 36 - 50 clothes pins
- cotton or plastic clothes line - 70' to 100'
- 24-bag roll of heavy duty trash bags - 33 to 45 gallon sizes
- 5 N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1 - 3 mm thick)
- 2 pairs kitchen dishwashing gloves - should be durable for multiple uses
- 1 pair work gloves - cotton with leather palm or all leather
- \$3.00 to cover the cost of sponges and shipping (not in bucket)
