Grateful!

I recently attended a three-day training event led by Christian author, Diana Butler Bass. If you ever have an opportunity to read her writing, take it! One of the many books that we studied was called,

"Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks." A clergyperson approaching the Thanksgiving season has much use for such a timely workshop.

I have to admit, that I went into this event with the thought that I knew everything there was to know about gratitude. I mean, how much could there really be? We need to be thankful! There. That's it. Right?

What Bass had to say was extraordinary. First, she talked about gratitude in a broad sense. Did you know that 78% of Americans feel a strong sense of gratitude on a weekly basis? Christians in the faith are highest. There are studies that link gratitude to recovery from serious illnesses and surgeries. And, gratitude produces powerful endorphins that quell pain and anxiety.

Did you know that because fear and gratitude come from different parts of the brain, you literally cannot be in a state of gratitude and a state of fear at the same time? Gratitude and anxiety counter-balance one another. Gratitude is something we can practice and master. Which one will win the day?

One of the things I found most fascinating was the idea that we have privatized gratitude. Bass states, "Individual gratefulness does not appear to make much difference in our larger common life. We don't truly celebrate common gratitude." If we look back in the Bible to various accounts, we read where early believers shared gratitude. They held it front and center. They celebrated their common blessings!

As we move into November, I would invite us to focus on our common blessings and to celebrate in one accord.

For the beauty of the earth, for the glory of the skies, for the love which from our birth over and around us lies. Christ, our Lord, to you we raise this, our hymn of grateful praise!" Amen!
